

Attendance Newsletter – Spring term

We have made a great start to the year with improved attendance, our whole school attendance for the autumn term (2025/2026) was 94.2%, which is a 2% improvement from the previous year of 92%. Well done so far. We will continue improving attendance across the federation, by continuing to work closely with families towards achieving our **school target of 97%**.

Mrs Richards will continue monitoring attendance and punctuality on a daily basis along with our Education Welfare Officer Miss Withers from Walsall Council. We are keen to ensure that all children attend school regularly, as you are aware, it is important for your child's friendships and academic progress. In addition, it is proven that good attendance is linked with academic success, throughout their educational learning journey. The school website is updated weekly, tracking attendance and punctuality. You can help us achieve this target throughout the year by ensuring your child has regular attendance.

Individual Attendance awards

Bronze, badges will be awarded this week to all children above 95%. We look forward to seeing many children proudly wearing these around school.

Silver badges will be awarded at the end of the spring term. Bronze badges can still be earned if attendance has improved above 95%

Each pupil received 5 class dojo's, the class certificate and the **golden trophy**

Autumn term 2 - 558 late codes were recorded. We will continue to work with families to make improvements this term and encourage all pupils to be in school on time. Please note gates open to all pupils at 8.30am until 8.50am, and lessons start promptly.

Weekly rewards are given to individual pupils for excellent punctuality and the year group with the least amount of late codes recorded are rewarded with extra playtime for **'Being in school on time!'**



Thank you to all pupils with attendance above 95% that took part in the first termly craft session of biscuit and cake decorating. We welcomed 258 pupils with some fantastic creations, sing-a-longs and dance moves to end the term perfectly.


In February all children will be taking part in Safer Internet Day. Children will gain a deeper understanding of online safety and how to ensure they are keeping themselves safe when online.
