#### Dear Parents/Carers.

Hope you all had a good break. With just a few weeks remaining before the spring term ends, we reach an important time to reflect on achievements so far and what we need to focus on over the remainder of the academic year.

I would like to begin by thanking you for supporting the Aqua House charity event, which raised awareness of the work of the emergency services. Through your generous donations, we were able to forward £240 to the Police Charity. We are hugely proud of the enthusiasm our children display each time such events are organised. Our House Captains and Vice Captains did a great job of supporting the activities taking place on the day. Children enjoyed the assemblies during which they found out about the work our Community Police Officers do.

We hope the parents who attended the Year 2 maths workshop found it useful to know how, 'Power Maths' is taught in KS1. Parents were able to gain an insight into the teaching methods and see how we use the resources to support learning.

Our children in Year 6 have been preparing for their end of Key Stage 2 SATs so are well into their revision programmes. The tests take place in May, week beginning 13/05/25. We will provide some further information closer to the date.

Opportunities for our children to experience learning in different ways is very much part of our approach to the wider curriculum, so trips/visits are being organised by staff to ensure children are able to take full advantage of what is on offer.

We continue to promote the importance of healthy lifestyles and active learning with sports coaches supplementing lunchtime activities for the children. The coaches always try to engage as many children as they can with a range of fun, multi-sport and orienteering activities.

You will also see that we have a number of events coming up, greatly enjoyed by all – World Book day is one such occasion when the children can dress-up to represent their favourite book characters and participate in reading activities with a difference. We have British Science Week coming up soon, when everyone is involved in specialised scientific learning – it is usually a great fun week for all! This year we are also planning a science exhibition. Further details of this will follow.

#### A few other updates:

Our dining room has been completely re-furbished and extended and now provides even better facilities for children during their lunchtimes.

At the front of school, we have opened up the area so that dismissal for Year 4 is easier, with a separate designated area for parents. We would greatly appreciate it if Year 5 and Year 6 parents could also use the waiting area designated for them, at dismissal time – this will really help with keeping everyone safe and avoiding any accidents.

Please note we are having CCTV cameras installed outside the building.


