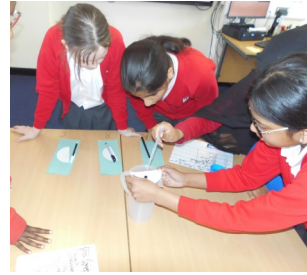
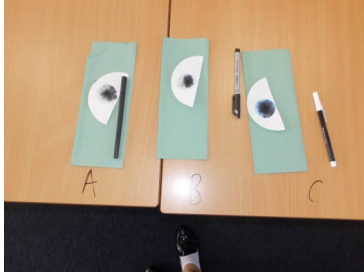


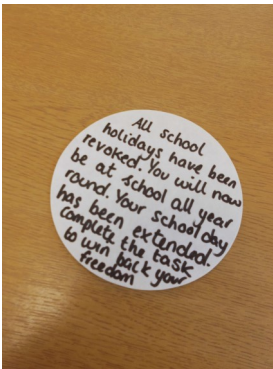
Year 6 Spring News

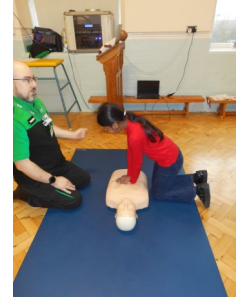

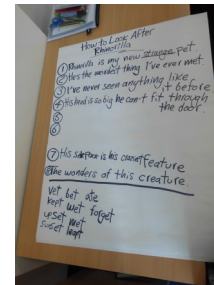
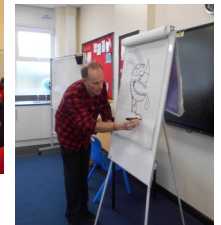


Chris White Author Visit
